**The Kaha Kamaska Foundation** will be in charge of strengthening the research and exhibition of the **White City** in the department of Gracias a Dios, in the western part of the country.

In 2015 the **White City** was added to the list of the seven great archaeological discoveries, a recognition that highlights the name of Honduras as a tourist destination completely attractive for foreigners. On the other hand, the Spanish edition of the book "**The Lost City of the Monkey God**", by author **Douglas Preston**, who was named honorary member of the **Kaha Kamasa Foundation**, was exhibited.

The activities were carried out within the framework of the presentation of the protection scheme for the Honduran Mosquitia.

The event was attended by characters from the United States cinematographic field, authorities of **the Honduran Institute of Science, Technology and Innovation (IHCIETI)**, the **Honduran Institute of Anthropology and History (IHAH)**, the **Institute of Forest Conservation (ICF)**, and representatives of several national and foreign organizations and personalities.

In addition, the filmmaker **Steve Elkins**, **Emmy** winner, leader of the exploration team of **Ciudad Blanca**, who was accompanied by doctors **Christopher Jordan**, coordinator for Central America and the **Tropical Andes** for the organization Global Wildlife Conservation; and **Jeremy Radachowsky**, director for Mesoamerica of the Wildlife Conservation Society.

For his part, **Elkins**, said that "it is a great honor to be part of the Foundation and together with **Douglas Preston** we recognize that this is something we want to continue in time beyond our lives because it is a wealth for Honduras and humanity".

"It's not just about speeches, that implies actions and with the Foundation and the book, we are seeing what is happening and is coming for Honduras, for Gracias a Dios and Olancho in terms of growth," said the secretary of **Development and Social Inclusion, Reinaldo Sánchez**,
